Then we went into the huge workshop where staging and props are made and into the costume room where we saw rack upon rack of costumes, hats, shoes and props.

## Playhouse Secrets

We were taken into the dressing rooms, the 'Green Room' and the Archive room. We learned that the 'language' of theatre is similar to the language of sailors, and reference is made to rigging, deck amongst many nautical terms. Arthur, our guide, told us many other interesting facts.

After our tour, Arthur talked to us about the history of the Salisbury Playhouse. He had prepared a small display of old programmes, posters and photos. Many famous names are associated with this theatre including Timorothy West, Prunella Scales, Stephanie Cole and Christopher Biggins to name just a few.
